High lights of FMA – NDF Meet

We had five days of FMA-NDF virtual meet organized by National Development Coordinator Sr. Azarias Arokia Mary Selvi of Trichy Province from 10th -14th August 2020 from 2.45 to 5.30 p.m. Seven FMA Social Development Officers and 2/3 core team members from each province participated in the meeting. Fr. Joe Xavier S.J. our consultant was our guide and resource person. The focus of the meeting was on Care for Common Home, Sustainable livelihood, Self employment and Child Rights. Our Social Ministry sector under the leadership of Sr. Rosy Lopez Director of CDEW have placed the emphasis on the following thematic areas under different target group.

Women: Sustainable Livelihood and Care for Common Home. This theme needs to be translated into action by our five centres namely: Maradiyur, Puthiyathura, Thope, Kanakakunnu and Fides. The Animators and Sisters in charge of Social Ministry of these centres will be oriented to take forward the IGP such as agriculture, animal husbandry, groceries, food processing, bakery, catering, petty shops and tailoring for the women. This year we aim at 250 families to attain sustainable livelihood and I am sure that we can achieve our target.


Youth: We ensure quality skill training which enables our young people to fetch a good job in the open competitive market or confidence to begin an employment of their own. We aim at reaching out to 600 young people from our four centres. We are envisioning to impart skills like E-commerce, 21st Century Skills, Digital Literacy, Textile Science, Garment Making Technology, Pattern Construction and Machine Machanism.

Child Rights: All our formal and non-formal sectors shall implement NCP (Neighborhood Children's Parliament) and Child Protection Policy particularly paying attention to children who are problematic, those from broken families, victims of child abuse and those with behavioral problems and so on. We are aware and we have experienced in our own States the children's suicidal tendency more than ever. Hence, we shall offer counseling, guidance and place possible alternatives and support to meet the dire needs of children, youth and women.


















Independence Day Celebration



SOCIAL MINISTRY WEBINAR ON CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAMME

Sr. Rosy Lopez, Director of CDEW organized a webinar to capacitate the Sisters who are carrying out the Social Ministry apostolate in their own respective communities of the Province. There was an overwhelming response of 95% and the participants were enthusiastic, attentive and every one assured their cooperation. Sr. Annie Toppil – Vice Provincial delivered the keynote address inviting everyone to follow the footsteps of our holy founders who worked with determination for the poor and needy children and youth of their time. Sr. Rosy Lopez explained the term "Social Ministry" as some were not clear about it. Whatever mission / activity that we do for the promotion of children, youth and women is called Social Ministry. It could be both formal and non formal.

She also briefed them about the **Social Ministry-Apostolic Plan for 2020-21** and its set activities. It puts emphasis on "Innovation and Effectiveness in Mission" and how to carry them out at different centres and what is expected from each centre. We want to see that our recipients: children, youth and women become self confident to face the various problems they might encounter tomorrow, to have the courage to raise their voices against injustice, become good leaders and agents of transformation who would protect, promote, nurture and uphold life in all its aspects. We continue Value Based Approach in our services in all YaR, NCP, IGP, SHG and VTC groups. Thus we bring out a profound impact on the direct beneficiares, families and on the wider community. She exhorted all the sisters to become self confident and efficient and pass on the same to the members of their groups. Thus we ensure our recipients of their responsibilities of contributing back to the society what they had received for their integral growth.
